

PRESIDENTS REPORT

2023 has seen a revitalised Mildura RSL Sub Branch with a remarkable new appearance. This year we have seen outstanding results with an overall solid financial performance, please read the treasurer's report for further details.

The results and success of our Sub Branch is a reflection of the General Manager, and staff's dedication to making the Mildura RSL a success. We have been privileged with the recruitment of younger Veterans' prepared to join the General Committee. They have been prepared to accept the challenges put before them, making our Sub Branch to be one of Victoria's most successful.

We have made a very large financial donation to the 'V' Centre which is located near the Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital. These funds went towards supporting the fit-out of the centre and in turn helping those Veterans experiencing homelessness.

Anzac Day service's witnessed an overwhelming return of the general public. Our special guest speaker Major Robert (Scott) Bailey presented a wonderful speech relating to his service in the Army.

We had a wonderful turnout including students from St. Joseph's Secondary College at the Nichols Point War Graves to commemorate and remember those brave men who lost their lives during training World War Two. This event highlights Mildura's strong RAAF history.

Remembrance Day Commemoration celebrated with a strong crowd. We had the pleasure of students from Mildura South Primary School. Their presence was created by the overwhelming support starting back in August, when Committee members Scott Richards and Brad McGlashan attended the school every day at lunch time to walk around their oval completing a total of a one hundred km pilgrimage to our Kokoda troops. In closing the audience had the pleasure of hearing one of Sunraysia's talented young vocalist Mariah Pain, sing the National Anthem beautifully.

Vietnam Veterans Day Commemoration service was well supported with a large turnout and to enhance the morning we introduced a guest speaker, Veteran Bernie Livingston, who spoke of his experiences in Vietnam and singer Gary Klippel who gave us his rendition of "I was only 19". To complete the day Hazel Symonds sang the National Anthem.

Over the last four years the Veteran's Centre managed by Paul Mensch has increased it's profile by offering more than pension/welfare assistance. Paul has become more open to different DVA/RSL Vic programs that raise awareness for the veteran community. These programs include health week and RSL Active, all of which are free to eligible veterans, and partners designed to enhance veterans' health and wellbeing. The Veteran's Centre article by Paul is in the Manager of Veteran's Services Report.

The sale of poppies and other merchandise throughout the year has seen the generosity of the community in support of all RSL Sub Branches. I'd like to thank our tireless volunteers who assist on these occasions, without their support sales would not be successful.

In conclusion I wish to publicly acknowledge our past committee members who are no longer with us. Earlier this year we lost Robert Bird, who gave his time and energy to the Mildura RSL without question. We then had to contend with Gary Pearse passing away, he left us in December. Gary was heavily involved with the RSL, joining our committee in 2008. He was our President for five years and vice President for four, in all it's an extraordinary length of time to voluntarily give our Sub Branch.

May all members have a wonderful 2024, your

patronage is appreciated. I'd like to thank staff for their assistance with the running of our RSL. To outgoing Committee members, your dedication and commitment has been well received whilst serving the Mildura RSL Sub Branch.

TREASURERS REPORT

The 2023 trading year has again resulted in a very strong overall profit of \$1,411,063. Welfare and Charitable expenditure is now divided between Veteran and Community activities.

Major renovation work since July has had a negative impact on gaming revenue through the latter part of the year. However it is pleasing to see that Bar and Bistro sales have consistently performed above budget.

Renovation costs as at the end of the year amounted to \$2,988,988. Further costs will be incurred in the first quarter of 2024 to complete the renovations. However, the good news is that the Sub Branch has not needed to borrow funds due to its strong position with term deposits accumulated over recent years.

As of December 31, 2023, term deposits were \$3,700,000. It is anticipated that at the completion of the building renovations, term deposits will be \$3,000,000.

The December financial results were somewhat reduced due to a \$100,000 donation to Vasey RSL Care. This is a contribution to the establishment of a facility to be known as the 'V' Centre Veteran Empowerment Program. This is scheduled to open in February 2024, providing accommodation and support for veterans who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. It will provide 16 apartments and 3 smaller suites with kitchen/dining areas, main sitting area and a multi purpose room including some gym equipment.

The donation is in line with our policy to support the veteran community as strongly as possible.

Our Balance sheet continues to grow from strength to strength with net equity of \$7.7 million as at 31st December 2023.

This will be my final report as Treasurer as I will not be standing for Committee in 2024. I need to thank Kim Archibald for his support over the years and also

Leigh Blenheim for his comprehensive financial reports each month.

GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

As members would be aware, the building renovations began in July 2023.

As is the case with most renovations, members have had reduced access to some areas of the Sub Branch including the front entrance, main lounge, function room, and toilet facilities. This has of course reduced sales in that 6 month period. The building works should be completed prior to Anzac Day 2024. Given the interruption of the building works, the overall profit of \$1,411,063 as detailed in the Treasurer's report was most pleasing. From a management perspective, it is always a challenge to grow revenue and keep expenditure in check. New electricity pricing applicable from December 2023 will result in a 28% increase in power costs.

Although the dark days of covid restrictions are now a few years behind us, it is still proving difficult to procure new staff as is the case in the hospitality industry the world over. There were periods in 2023 where reduced staff numbers did make it difficult to operate on some days. To that end, I want to thank all staff who did extra shifts to ensure we could offer a standard of service the members are accustomed to.

In July 2023 the Victorian state government announced it would be introducing new measures to restrict money laundering and further protect problem gamblers. One of the new initiatives will be the introduction of mandatory pre-commitment on gaming machines. The new requirement will inevitably have a negative impact on gaming revenue. It is most likely the introduction of the reforms will be late 2025. It is imperative the Mildura RSL is well placed to ensure it can remain financially stable if revenue declines.

It is anticipated that the Sub Branch will have \$4M in cash reserves by the end of 2025, that combined with a recently refurbished facility, puts the Mildura RSL in good stead to get through the difficulties of the new regulations.

The Mildura RSL's commitment to supporting veterans and their families remains our priority.

I must say that I am extremely proud to be part of an RSL that does exactly that. A recent donation of \$100,000 to the Vasey RSL Care V Center is an example of the good we do in supporting veterans and their families.

The new large screens in the foyer area are being used to honour our local veterans, the layout of the images has been very well received by members. It is another way of ensuring our veterans are honoured and remembered.

I would like to sincerely think Mark Turlan, the Assistant Manager for his support during the year.

A thank you also to Leigh Blenheim, Alana Ashelford and Tammie Doering for their excellent admin work.

I want to commend all staff for their commitment to the Mildura RSL during 2023.

I thank the President Paul McDermott and the committee for their ongoing support during 2023.

MANAGER OF VETERANS SERVICES REPORT

The Mildura RSL Veterans Centre has seen a very busy and productive 2023.

More than 130 veterans and their families have come to the Veterans Centre during 2023 to seek help with DVA claims and welfare. It is great to see that word is spreading that the Mildura RSL has support available and that veterans and their families are comfortable accessing that support.

My primary role is to support veterans and their families with pensions and welfare support, but I also am now involved in the administration of the Mildura RSL's Retirement Village which consists of 20 units, and conducting RSL Funerals. Other responsibilities include overseeing the operation of the Mildura RSL's RAAF Air Museum, the coordination of appeals, coordinating RSL Active events and the administration of Commemoration Services.

In 2023, the Mildura RSL conducted Anzac Day, Remembrance Day, Vietnam Veterans Day and the Bombing of Darwin Day ceremonies. On top of that, the Sub Branch was also involved in a national event, the Vietnam Veterans Vigil. You can read more about this on page 15 of this report.

The RSL Active events throughout 2023 were very well attended and enjoyed by veterans and their families alike. I would like to thank Brad and Bree McGlashan for their tireless support to make these events happen.

Last year, The Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide tabled its interim report. One recommendation, to increase DVA staff by 500 employees, has started to take effect. The time taken to process claims has started to decrease considerably in recent months and I am hopeful that it will continue to drop as DVA work through the massive backlog of claims.

I would like to thank President Paul McDermott, Manager Kim Archibald and the entire committee for their continued support. It is their dedication to the support of veterans and their families that make my job possible.

I am committed to helping all veterans and their families on our community and my door is always open.

WALKING OFF THE WAR WITHIN

While the overall attendance was slightly lower this year, most of the participants were returning attendees who wanted to surpass their previous achievements. On October 14th, we saw more than 500 individuals join forces for our mental health awareness walk. Many others also came to show their support. Even though the total number of participants decreased, we saw a significant increase in those who successfully completed the challenging 20-kilometer distance. This shows the determination and commitment of our attendees to push themselves and grow personally.

The Walking Off The War Within committee wish to express our deepest gratitude to the Mildura RSL for their unwavering support throughout the event. Your financial contributions, providing a great meeting space, promoting the event to your members and community, and your gracious hospitality at the end was invaluable to its success.

The Walking Off the War Within movement aims to challenge the stigma around mental health issues and encourage open conversations. By sharing personal experiences, providing information and support, and promoting mental health literacy, our goal is to empower all individuals to seek the help they need.

This event was inspired by Nathan Shanahan, an exservice member and career firefighter, who walked from Mildura to Adelaide in April 2015. Nathan marched over 400km, carrying a heavy pack, to raise awareness about Post-Traumatic Stress Injury and Depression. His journey symbolised his own battle with mental illness and represented the struggle many individuals face.

None of this would have been possible without the generous and continuous support of the Mildura RSL. You were our primary sponsor, making an initial donation of \$5,000. In the past, these funds were used to purchase promotional materials like an inflatable arch and banners. This year, we focused on inclusivity, ensuring there were enjoyable activities for all participants. With the donated funds, we provided additional seating, live music, and family-friendly activities that were a huge success. These activities were offered free of charge, giving relief to families facing financial pressure.

MILDURA SOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL KOKODA MARCH

Mildura South Primary School students Have walked 100km in honour of Australia's Kokoda veterans. Students completed their first laps of the school on Monday, August 21st and continued walking every lunch time until November 10th.

The school's Kokoda Track Experience begun in 2019, but was disrupted by COVID. Students are split into teams and have to complete tasks during their walk, such as putting up and packing down a tent, carrying a person on a stretcher and radioing in to homebase.

Mildura RSL committee members, Brad McGlashan and Scott Richards volunteered their time and walked along side the students every step of the way. They were there every lunch time to accompany the students, offer encouragement and to answer questions about their time in the army.

Each student was allocated a local soldier who served on Kokoda and learnt about their story and walked in their honour.

On the 10th of November the school held a service in honour of the local soldiers. This ceremony was

attended by most of the Mildura RSL committee and wreaths were laid. The names of each soldier was read out and each student walked up to the school's memorial and placed a cross in the garden for their assigned soldier.

The program is coordinated by School psychologist teacher, Maurie Milani. Mr Milani said that when the Mildura South Primary School started this program in 2019, they were told by RSL veterans that it was probably the first time their names had been read aloud since World War II.

Mr Milani said as far as he was aware, Mildura South was the only primary school that ran an experience like this and was one of only a few schools that had their own war memorial.

Mildura RSL President, Paul McDermott said that the students had done a fantastic job. "The ceremony was very moving and very well executed and the students show a great understanding of our local soldiers who served on Kokoda."







WALPEUP SILO ART TRIBUTE

The Mildura RSL made a significant contribution towards the realisation of the mural on a silo at Walpeup.

The project had been more than four years in the planning and was finally completed in June this year.

It is a poignant tribute to the Walpeup's Anzac history and was painted by renowned artist, Julian Clavijo.

The chosen art is a tribute to the local men and women from the area who went to war, including teenager Harold Thomas Bell.

He like many, enlisted for World War One under an alias, using his cousins last name, Wickham, to disguise his true age.

The teenager was shot in the leg during the Battle of Beersheba on October 31st, 1917 and died of his wounds the following day. He was 16 years and seven months old.

RSL President, Mr Paul McDermott, said that it was a worthy project that recognised the story of not only Harold Bell, but of many young men who left the district to go to war.

"It will allow visitors to Walpeup to pause and reflect on the sacrifice that was made by the men and women of the mallee." Mr McDermott said.

Walpeup is situated 30 kilometres west of Ouyen on the Mallee Highway.

MILDURA RSL MEMORABILIA REPORT 2023

With major renovations taking place during the second half of 2023 much of our memorabilia collection has been off display. We are looking forward to having the collection back on display in the not-too-distant future. I'm pleased to say that there will be more cabinetry added in the snooker bar with the main aim to get all firearms and swords on display in one area. There are many rules and regulations that must be considered regarding the display of firearms.

We only received one donation of note last year from the family of the late David Jeffrey Steven.

David was born in Scotland in 1918 and emigrated to Australia with his family. Prior to enlisting into the Royal Australian Navy in October 1939 he was living in Mildura. On completing his training, he qualified as an Ordnance Artificer (gunnery maintenance). In October 1940 he was posted to HMAS Hobart.

David was to see a great deal of action in the two years he spent on this vessel. During this time, he made a model of the Hobart out of steel. This, along



with numerous photographs, ship plaques, uniform and other items are now part of the Mildura RSLs collection. I'm sure that on looking at the photograph of the model below you'll agree that David was a very talented young man.

VIETNAM VETERANS VIGIL

Services to remember two Sunraysia soldiers who were killed in the Vietnam War was held concurrently on Thursday, August 3, 2023.

They were part of a nationwide effort to hold coinciding vigils for fallen Vietnam War soldiers at every grave or commemorative plaque site at 11am.

The Mildura RSL hosted a vigil at the graveside of Ramon John Peter Deed at the Nichols Point Cemetery, while the Merbein RSL held one at the graveside of Noel Charles Pettitt at the Merbein cemetery.

The Mildura Service saw the veteran community come together to honour a fallen comrade.

Wreath's were laid by the Mildura RSL, Vietnam veterans and family of Raymon Deed.

August 3rd marked the 60th anniversary of the first Australian soldiers to arrive in Vietnam, and the 50th anniversary of the last soldiers to leave.

Mildura RSL's Manager of Veterans' services, Paul Mensch, said the synchronised ceremonies were something quite special.

"It's quite a poignant thing to have it synchronised and happen throughout the country at the same time," he said.

Ramon Deed was just 21 when he died of injuries in South Vietnam on May 10, 1967, from wounds received during mine laying operations the previous day.

Noel Pettitt was also 21 when he died of injuries in South Vietnam on November 27, 1967.

Merbein RSL president Brian Munro said the pair were among 523 Australian soldiers who never came home.

"He (Pettitt) was only 21 when he got killed over there, so he didn't get much of a chance for it," he said.

Mr Mensch said the commemoration effort came ahead of Vietnam Veterans Day on August 18, where a service was held at Mildura's Seventh Street Memorial at 12.30pm.

"The guys who served in Vietnam weren't treated that well when they got home," he said. "It's nice to see that they are getting the recognition they deserve, albeit a long time overdue."









MILDURA RSL RAAF AIR MUSEUM



A Business Case has been developed by the Mildura Council, the Mildura Airport, 2OTU Heritage Group and the Mildura RSL for a new World War Two Aviation Training & Kittyhawk Museum.

The business case will be used to source funding from State and Federal government grants and private investments. The museum

will also showcase the five main aircraft flown at RAAF Mildura and will be a significant tourist attraction for the entire district.

The five aircraft will be static displays of the Kittyhawk, Boomerang, Wirraway, Spitfire and Mustang aircraft. Funding applications will be submitted in the near future.

The Sabre Jet restoration is nearing completion and will be a great drawcard for the existing museum as well as into the future when the new museum is completed.

~ PAST PRESIDENT VALE ~ Gary Pearse 1953-2023


Gary joined the Citizen Military Forces on the 26th of April 1971, the day after Anzac Day. He was posted to 1 Independent Rifle Company where he remained until his discharge on 31st of March 1973.

Gary rejoined the Army Reserve on the 31st of March 1980 and was posted to second Battalion the Royal Victoria Regiment. On the 1st of December 1983, Gary was assigned to Number three Recruit Training Unit where he worked as a rifleman and instructor.

On the 30th of June 1988, Gary was posted to the 8/7th Battalion Royal Victoria Regiment, where he remained until his discharge on the 5th of July 1995.

For his service, Gary was awarded the Reserve Force Medal and the Australian Defence Medal.

Gary was elected to the committee of the Mildura RSL in 2008 and served as Vice President from 2014 to 2016. He was elected President in 2017 and held the office until 2022. He was Vice President at the time of his passing.



PETER WHITTLE

Peter Whittle has led an extraordinary life that has seen him working at all four corners of the world in a variety of roles, all centred on saving lives.

He was born in 1942 in the village of Meols in Cheshire, England to parents Cyril and Doris Whittle. He attended the Royal Masonic School in Bushey just outside of London and only went home three times a year.

After he left school, Peter trained as a lighting technician for stage and television. He worked at a theatre where during the day he worked on the electrics getting everything ready for the show and in the evenings, he would operate the main stage spotlight at the back of the theatre.

Peter's mother was his fathers second wife, his first wife had died of cancer, before which, they had a daughter named Joan, who was a theatre nurse in London.

Joan had met a man named John Hills who was an Australian Fighter Pilot and after the war they ended up running a sheep and cattle property in Western Australia.

Peter, who was almost 18 at this point, accepted an invitation to work on the property so he slapped down 10 pounds and took a ship to WA, along with a lot of other 10-pound poms.

Joan picked him up in Fremantle and took him out to

the farm where he stayed for a couple of months. Life on the station wasn't really for him though and it wasn't long before he was in Perth where he started a job with TVW 7 as a lighting technician.

He eventually left channel 7 and looked for opportunities in the hospital environment which had always interested him.

Peter trained as a male nurse in Perth and after a period of time he took up a position in Exmouth working as a field medic for a company that was building the US Navy communication station at North West Cape.

He worked there for 2 years and was responsible for the welfare of more than 500 people. He returned to Perth and tried his hand at psychiatric nursing which he didn't enjoy at all.

It was then that Peter turned to the Australian Army and enlisted and was on a train east to eventually start his basic training at Kapooka. He excelled at basic training and was named Dux of the course which resulting in him having the chose his own corps. He went for medical and was transferred to Healesville for training.

He also undertook theatre training in Brisbane before



getting the word that he was being shipped out for Vietnam. He arrived in Vung Tau and went straight to work tending the wounded.

The sirens would go off and it was all hands on deck, every available man, including the cooks would run down to the landing pad to standby to receive the incoming choppers. The wounded were taken out of the choppers into the triage bay to be checked by the RSM who removed any weapons.

> It was par for the course on a daily basis to see men with limbs blown off from land mine explosions and bullet wounds that had ripped through tissue.

> After 12 months he returned to Australia in 1970 but being in the theatre of war had a profound impact on him, which endures to this day. He was discharged in Melbourne and got a job at the Alfred hospital in the anaesthetic department, which was a bit mundane for his liking so he started work for St John Ambulance in Fitzroy.

Peter was one of the first responders when the Westgate Bridge collapsed in 1970 killing 35 workers.

Throughout his career, Peter has worked for Ambulance Victoria, BHP, Samsung and Daewoo. Always in the medical field. He has worked on oil rigs in Bass Strait, New Guinea, South Korea, Thailand, Algeria and Indonesia.

It was in Indonesia that he met Nia, they married 14 years ago and decided to make Mildura their home.

Peter believes that he would not have survived his PTSD if were not for Nia, she helps get through the bad times, she is his rock.



RSL ACTIVE

The Mildura RSL has been hosting RSL Active events throughout 2023, attracting veterans and their families from a wide variety of age groups bringing people together.

In April of 2023, a bus trip, taking in the RAAF War Graves, a bombing range and crash site from World War Two, a BBQ lunch finishing with a tour of the RAAF Museum saw more than forty people take part.

In May, a day at the Mildura Ten Pin Bowling saw a large turnout and in June we headed to the Mildura Driving Range .

A bus trip to the Millewa Pioneer Park in July was enjoyed by all and in August a family come and try day at Mildura Martial Arts saw kids and adults alike having a great time.

A Spring Picnic was held at JC Park in September where a BBQ Lunch was provided and included games and activities for the kids.

October saw our veterans and their families explore Woodsies Gem Shop, enjoying the display caves and magic maze. Lunch was also provided.

The final event of the year was a Xmas Party at Lake Cullulleraine hosted by Tranquil Water Caravan Park. A
